## Key barrier to educational achievement A: Communication and Language (EYFS focus)

Attainment gaps for pupil premium pupils are under the assessment area of communication and language. Competency in this area feeds into the wider curriculum, in particular reading comprehension and writing which are areas for development.

Research demonstrates that the effective deployment of support staff in the classroom leads to accelerated progress for pupils. This is required across all ability groups in order for the gap between pupil premium and their peers to close in all subjects.

Key barrier to educational achievement C: The percentage of pupil premium pupils who are 'off track' to meet their targets in reading in Key Stage.

Data shows that an attainment gap is slowly widening over time. Monitoring shows there is a need for greater opportunity for pupils in Key Stage 2 to be taught and practice a range of comprehension skills. Gaps in resources in Key Stage 2 have been identified as one of the barriers to this being achieved.
