

Virtual Tour: Nursery (FS1)

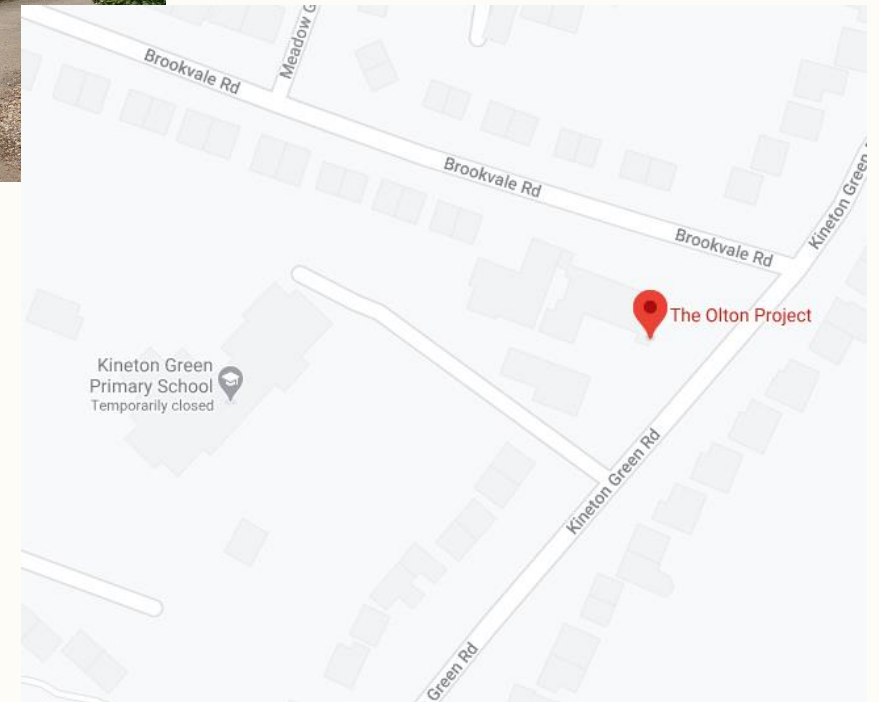
This is the front of the school and the main access point.

However, Nursery children will be accessing from the side entrance to enable them to keep separate from other 'bubbles' of children.

Mrs Shipley and Miss Rose will be at the gate at 8.55 to welcome the children into Nursery.

Due to COVID, parents are currently not permitted on site.



This is the Nursery outdoor area.

The children will hang up their coats and hats (if wearing them) and then enter the main classroom.

All children will wash their hands when they enter the classroom.



The EYFS building is split into Reception and Nursery by the red room divider pictured here.

Whilst we previously held joint assemblies and events, these 'bubbles' will be kept separate under the current guidance.



There is the creative area, where children can make, paint, draw and create! We are very lucky to be over-flowing with materials at the moment, particularly junk modelling!

We also have a sand and water tray.



There is an interactive whiteboard and plenty of room for the children to sit on the carpet for whole class teaching – such as during the register, story time, singing and even some yoga!



We have a number of different learning areas in the classroom, such as role play, construction, small world, book corner, maths, phonics.



If the children are staying to attend Beehive in the afternoon, they will be collected by the Beehive staff and walked down to the school hall.

Here they will eat either a school dinner or their packed lunch.

They will have outside play in the Nursery area, rather than the main school playground.



The children will spend the rest of their day in the Beehive area, and will need to be collected from the Beehive entrance.

You will need to buzz the office for access, and then walk all the way down the path, to the back of school. You will then need to buzz again and then walk across the playground, where you can wait at the Beehive door for the staff to bring your child to you.



If your child is being collected at 11.55, you will need to be ready to pick them up at the gate to The Olton Project.
